Meeting Goal

To examine student arrival logistics, operational needs, and equity impacts in-depth while beginning the formation of operational recommendations.

Projected Implementation Timeline

- January 14, 2026: Committee walk-through at E.C. Glass.
- January 20, 2026: Implementation begins at E.C. Glass.
- **February 16, 2026:** Implementation begins at Heritage High School.
- March 9, 2026: Goal to have both schools through a three-week monitoring and implementation phase.
- April 3, 2026: Full system functioning by the start of Spring Break.

Operational Concerns & Training

- Entry Flow: E.C. Glass currently uses the same door for both bus and car riders.
- Phasing Students: M. Goff suggested starting with smaller groups of students to help them learn the process rather than having the entire student body go through on day one.
- Safety Training: Nick Caputo will provide training to staff on what to do if a firearm is discovered.
- Search Refusal: If a student refuses the search or the detector, parents will be contacted; the student cannot enter without a search.
- Infrastructure: Suggestions were made to prevent students from bypassing the process via the auditorium lobby's swing doors.

Equity & Student Experience

- The committee discussed how to maintain a welcoming climate and ensure the process is non-stigmatizing.
- Accommodations: Specific plans are needed for students with medical devices or those using wheelchairs.

Preliminary Recommendations

- Define the number of open lanes required at each building.
- Hire additional temporary staff for the first 1–2 weeks of rollout.
- Develop a contingency plan for inclement weather.
