At-Home Learning Kits

Each student will receive an at-home learning kit. Each kit will have grade level specific materials and supplies that students will use to help make virtual learning more tangible. Each kit will be scanned and assigned to individual students on the Family Orientation Event.

Families are responsible for returning the items that are in this at-home learning kit at the end of the school year. Some materials will not be in the at-home learning kits to start the school year but teachers will be sure to give them these items at in-person events before students are expected to use them. An example 1st grade kit is pictured below.







Success from the Start!

As we start off the new school year, our teachers will guide students through Canvas and how to locate important course information. It will take time to feel comfortable with how to navigate Canvas and access the curriculum. Students will also learn how to appropriately use Zoom for their meetings.

Tips for Student Success

- → Post student's class schedule on refrigerator or next to their desk
- → Daily Routine (just like if they were in-person): Getting up and dressed, having a good breakfast, going to designated spot to start learning
- → Find a comfortable place to learn (could be at a table or a desk in their room)
- → Remind/assist your student with logging into homeroom/classes on time. Homeroom is 8 a.m.
- → Students are to join live synchronous sessions as well as attend any afternoon sessions
- → Set a time for students to engage in their asynchronous work in Canvas

Creating a Virtual Learning Space

As you prepare for your student to be a virtual learner, having a designated space where they can learn. This space can be one that they have decorated and feel comfortable as teachers create a fun learning environment in the classroom. Have students pick out a small desk or table where they can keep their school supplies as well as a specific place where they can put their schedule for the day.

Goals for Creating a Learning Space:

- 1. Minimize distractions
- 2. Lighting
- 3. Meets the needs of your student
- 4. Space for school supplies (Chromebook/Tablet, At Home Learning Kit, Internet, Outlets)



A Day in the Life of a Trailblazing Student

You may wonder what a day is like for a Virtual Academy student. Let's take a glance at what a typical day could look like for a student.



"David" 5th Grader at LVA

Time	Activity
7:00 AM	David wakes up, gets dressed, and eats breakfast.
8:00 AM	David logs onto his LCS Chromebook and clicks on his homeroom zoom link. David watches the Morning Announcements and engages in different activities with Mrs. Heidorn and classmates.
8:15-12:00 PM	David spends the morning in his different subjects with Mrs. Heidorn. She makes sure students take breaks between subjects. David may grab a snack or bathroom break during those times. Mrs. Heidorn also meets with students in small groups during the week.
12:00 PM	David is done with live zoom classes for the day. He takes a break to eat lunch and unwind.
12:45 PM	David works on some asynchronous assignments that are due that night and the following night. His teacher is available to meet via Zoom during the early afternoon on this particular day.
2:00 PM	David is done with his assignments and hangs out with some friends in his neighborhood.



Attendance

- → Students are to attend Homeroom as initial attendance will be taken at this time.
 - ◆ All student absences are recorded as unexcused until the parent or guardian sends a written note or email to provide a justifiable reason for the absence. We do not excuse absences via phone calls. The email address for sending attendance notes is rossoncs@lcsedu.net. Students have 2 days upon their return to zooms to provide a note of excuse or a doctor's note. After that time, the absence will remain unexcused. Use this link to submit your school absence note.
 - ◆ Acceptable excuses include illness of a student; serious illness in the family which necessitates the absence of the student; death in the family; required court appearance; special and recognized holiday; and other reasons which may be approved by the school administration. After 10 excused absences, the only notes that will be accepted are professional notes such as a doctor's note or a note from court.
 - ◆ Five Unexcused Absences
 If a student reaches five unexcused absences during the school year a
 letter requesting a parent conference is mailed to the parent or guardian.
 Once a student has accumulated seven or more unexcused absences during
 the school year students are referred to the truancy office and parents and
 students are required to attend an Interagency Truancy Review Team
 (ITRT) meeting. **After 15 consecutive days of excused or unexcused
 absences, a student will be dropped from the roster of the school.

→ The Virtual Academy will work hard to keep you informed about important information and events that are taking place. You will receive text messages, phone calls, and emails from us on a weekly basis sharing the *Trailblazer Times*, our weekly newsletter. Please also check our calendar to stay up to date on all events taking place.



Camera Expectations

Recent studies have shown that virtual students who turn their cameras on during live instruction increase their productivity, create more personal connections, and reduce a sense of isolation. Allowing cameras to be turned off for an indefinite period of time allows students to tune out class discussions and, with the plethora of distractions at home, may ensure that they stay sidetracked for the rest of the lesson.

At the LCS Virtual Academy, we require that students join each class period with their cameras on and keep them on during class unless there is documentation as an approved accommodation or the student has Mr. Boyd's approval. Below, we share reasons why we require cameras to be on during class and the process a student should follow to ask for a camera break.

GOAL: to help all of our students make decisions that best support their learning. We know that no student can spend every minute of synchronous learning on camera. We encourage all students to advocate for their needs during class time if they need camera breaks.



A Virtual Academy Student's Schedule

Additional High School Schedule & Course Information

Withdrawal from a Course

All requests for a student to be withdrawn from a course shall be made in writing, signed by a parent/guardian, and turned in to Ms. Edmondson by the end of the 5th school day of the course. Any course from which a student is withdrawn within that time period will not be recorded on the student's report card or transcript. In rare cases, extenuating circumstances may justify a withdrawal from a course after the 5th day. In such a case, the student's transcript will reflect the course and a grade of withdrawal passing (WP) or withdrawal failing (WF) for the course. These designations (WP and WF) are not considered in Grade Point Average calculations. A parent/guardian must file a written request for such consideration with the building principal, and that request must clearly indicate the extenuating circumstances to justify a withdrawal. If the request is to change the level of a course rather than withdraw from a course, that request must be made no later than five days after the first report card has been distributed. In some cases there may not be an alternative level to the same course. For additional procedures, please refer to Lynchburg City School Board Policies and Administrative Regulations IKC-RZ.

Course Load

Students in grades 9-11 must carry the equivalent of seven credit-bearing courses and may elect to carry another approved course in the eighth period. Approval of an additional elective course is based on the student's current standing and the course enrollment numbers. Students that do not choose to elect to carry another approved course in the eighth period will be enrolled in an enrichment or advisory period. All students in grade twelve (senior students) must carry the equivalent of four credit-bearing courses (athletes must carry five courses). Unless prior written permission by the principal is provided, senior students must also carry other approved courses or repeat courses in the other three periods. When scheduling courses that involve travel between different schools, students should be aware of the travel time and the fact that it may reduce the number of courses that could be taken. A senior desiring to carry more or less than seven credit-bearing courses must receive written permission to do so from the school's principal.



Promotion

According to Lynchburg City School Board Policies and Administrative Regulations Policy IGBEZ Promotion and Retention high school credit requirements for promotion are as follows. These credits indicated the cumulative amount that must be earned as that point in order to be promoted to the next grade level.

- 9th to 10th Grade (4 credits)
- 10th to 11th Grade (9 credits)
- 11th to 12th Grade (15 credits)



Checking In With Your Student's Teacher

→ You can reach your student's teacher through phone calls, email, or Canvas message.

Tracking Your Student's Progress

- → You will be able to see your student's grades in Canvas through your Parent Observer Account.
- → We will be assisting you with setting up your Parent Observer account before the new school year starts in August at our Family Orientation Events.
- → You will also be able to see quarterly grades in Infinite Campus through your parent portal. We can assist you with setting up your parent portal as well if you do not have one.

Assignments, Due Dates, and Late Work

- → Students are expected to follow the due dates set by their teacher(s). The reason for this is to prevent students from falling too far behind in their course work. Unlike in-person learning, the number of assignments can grow quickly in a virtual setting, causing students to fall behind quickly.
- → Teachers will share specifics about grading policies and late policies.
- \rightarrow Assignments are locked at the interim period (4 $\frac{1}{2}$ weeks) into the marking period and at the end of each marking period and are not unlocked except for extenuating circumstances.



Academic Supports and Interventions

What happens if my student begins to struggle learning virtually? Our program has developed some supports and interventions that we will put into place to help your student get back on track.

First, it is extremely important that parents and students are staying connected with us in our communication regarding assignment due dates, remediation opportunities, and other aspects of the program. We ask **ALL** parents/guardians to be connected to the <u>Canvas</u> <u>Parent Observer Account</u>. There will be many opportunities for parents to be connected to Canvas before school starts.

Our teachers and staff will be monitoring your student's attendance and academic progress weekly. If they notice them slipping in their attendance, work completion, or understanding of the content, they will reach out to the student FIRST to set up time to meet and determine what's causing the slip. Parents/guardians will also be alerted in situations where initial interventions are unsuccessful. Below is the process that we will follow to help your student get back on track.

LVA staff member or parent identifies that the student is struggling with one or more of the following areas: 1) Attendance 2) Work Completion 3) Content Achievement Student Support Meetings will be scheduled at or close to the interim time of the marking period (4th week).

Then

- LVA staff member(s)
 and parents meet and
 discuss concerns
- LVA staff members and parent/guardian discuss appropriate intervention(s) to use for the next 3-4 weeks.
- Goal(s) are set and parameters are set.
- Future meeting date is set for review of goal(s).
 These will typically take place at or near the end of the marking period.

Finally

- LVA staff member(s) and parents/guardians meet to discuss progress towards goals.
- If sufficient progress has been made towards goals, Student Support Team may choose to monitor and reconvene as needed.
- If insufficient progress has been made towards goals, the Student Support Team will discuss next steps. Those could include:
 - a) Additional intervention options.
 - Return to in-person learning at the student's base school.




On-Site Support - "The Stable"

Students will also be able to come into the LVA offices and take advantage of on-site support on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of every month from 1:00 - 3:00 P.M. in room 166, also known as "The Stable". If a student wants to come over and work on assignments, either individually or collaboratively, and is not requesting any staff support, they are welcome to just come over. If a student is requesting staff support on an assignment, skill, or project, they must sign up using the appropriate form, so that the teacher can be sure to be available.

"The Stable" will also have opportunities for students to get snacks and refreshments while attending. Some snacks may be available for a small cost.

Due to being a learning environment, we will ask all students to be mindful of their voice-level when working in "The Stable", so that other students are not distracted. The Stable staff monitor will reserve the right to ask students to exit if they are not meeting the expectations set forth by LVA.





Returning to In-Person Learning, Promotion and Retention

Students who wish to return to in-person learning during the school year must adhere to the following policy:

- Contact the Virtual Academy office to make your request for your child or children to return to in-person learning.
- The Virtual Academy will collaborate with the base school to facilitate the transition process at the end of a marking period.
- Parents should not contact their child's base school about returning to in-person learning before contacting the Virtual Academy offices.

Students can be asked to return to their base school for the following reasons:

- Insufficient academic progress
- Truancy

Students who are asked to return to their base school will also take place at the end of a marking period.

School board policy IGBEZ states that student promotion to the next grade level is successfully completing the current year academic requirements and advancing to the next grade level. Student retention is failing to complete the current year academic requirements and remaining in the current grade level.

Students who are not meeting the academic requirements for the school year will have meetings with LVA staff and their parents to discuss interventions to best help the student. By the end of the 3rd quarter, the family will be notified if retention is going to be recommended and the student will remain in the current grade level.



In-Person Learning at the Virtual Academy

In-Person Gatherings

In-person learning at a virtual school? Even though our students' primary mode of learning is virtual, there are still many benefits to learning with their teachers and peers in the same classroom.

Each month, our students will participate in learning activities either at an LCS site or off-site with one of our community partners. These In-Person Gatherings are REQUIRED for students to attend; this is considered a school day. If a student cannot attend an in-person gathering, a valid excuse must be shared with our office staff. Transportation will be provided to all monthly gatherings. Please check the LCS Virtual Academy calendar to see more details about our in-person events.

Due to additional space available at the Virtual Academy, students will be able to come into our offices to get 1:1 and small group in-person support and help from their teacher(s). Teachers will be able to host in-person science lab experiments and sessions. Science teachers will alert parents to those dates and also put them on the Virtual Academy calendar

Virtual Virginia is a provider of courses and teachers through the Virginia Department of Education. The Virtual Academy uses Virtual Virginia for courses that they cannot currently offer through LCS teachers.
Enrollment	Can my child leave the Virtual Academy whenever they want and go back to their base school?	Yes and no. A student may return to their base school during the school year. However, due to scheduling and other factors, the base school and Virtual Academy ask that you wait until a quarter or semester mark before this occurs. We will coordinate with your student's base school to make the transition as seamless as possible.
