Welcome and Introductions-

Approval of January PTO Minutes

- -Motion to approve January minutes made by Trish Pabis
- -Seconded by **Danielle Englund**

All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries. January Minutes are approved. As a FYI, this school year, meeting minutes will be sent out via Infinite Campus by **Ms. Davis**, and will also be posted on the school's website.

Principal/Staff Report-

- -Mrs. Baldwin communicated that the Faculty and Teaching staff was disappointed to hear that there would not be a Carnival this year. They did offer a possible suggestion about perhaps having another event such as a "Walkathon" -Mrs. Baldwin also shared that she was contacted by a community member about bringing more male figures into the building as inspirational and positive role models. There was interested in gathering more information about the Watch DOGS program that targets male role models to volunteer in the building. -Parent Pickup and Carpool line was brought up as a concern to Mrs. Baldwin by Sarah Muminovic. She indicated that Mr. Haupt, who had been in the role of traffic guard, was no longer an employee of R.S. Payne. That the traffic guard position was posted as a job opening on the LCS career opportunities website and a replacement guard would be hired. In the interim, Mr. Stauby, from movement ed has volunteered to take on this role.
- -Mrs. Baldwin indicated that Spring Parent/Teacher Conferences would not be a building wide initiative, but teachers will be reaching out directly to those who will be needing conferences.
- **-Lori Smith** communicated that this year's CANstruction was underway; this year's themeNemo. Last year's Hoover Dam is up for voting on GO Center FaceBook page for recognition among other CANstruction projects across the world.

-Lori Smith also shared that I LOVE Math Day is on February 16th. They are still in need of lots of volunteers for this. There seemed to be some confusion as to how the Sign-Up Genius was sent out and that it did not appear to have made it to all homes. **Mrs. Smith** will communicate with **Mrs. Proffitt** about resending the links for volunteering at I LOVE Math Day.

Parent Partner Reports

Pre-K-Parent Partner Kelly Brown

- -Fairly self-sufficient, don't require much
- -Mrs.Donigan and Ms.Jackson present during meeting.
- -Classroom needs; more parental involvement i.e.,center helpers, lunch/breakfast partners, field trip helpers
- **-Kelly Brown** will send an email out to parents looking for volunteers in this capacity
- Pre-K is ever so grateful and thankful for all money that they have received from the PTO for the cooking program; PTO provides \$350 a year to fund this program to support learning letters
- **-Sheri Quinones** inquired about whether the school wide events are marketed to the Pre-K events. **Kelly Brown** said yes but was unsure about the turn out by the Pre-K classes.
- **-Danielle Englund** noted that many of the students in the Pre-K are not in their base schools and that may be affecting the amount of parental involvement in the Pre-K classrooms.
- -Pre-K teachers asked if on conference days if the meals supplied could be given to units specifically as it is not always easy for teachers to get to eat as conferences tend to run over etc.
- -Mrs. Donigan did ask for the PTO to potentially fund a unit "Family Night"
- **-Sarah Muminovic** inquired about whether the school wide events were age appropriate and Mrs. Brown thinks so.
- **-Sheri Quinones** suggested that **Kelly Brown** reach out to **Roxanne Ferguson**, another Pre-K parent, for possible support in Pre-K.

3rd Grade-Parent Partner, Elianna Lobb

- -Ms.Townes and Ms.Beuerle present
- -Productive dialogue overall during meeting
- -Parental involvement is an issue, but they have noted that they are separating out volunteers that help the students and those that help the teachers
- -Being creative about how to utilize their time as to not take away from classroom instruction time
- -Will not have a Valentine's party because they felt it would infringe on the classroom instruction time
- -Possible parent volunteers to assist in the preparation of learning activities.
- -SOLs-low pass rate, they feel as though they spend a ton of time talking about how to inspire kids to perform their best, request goodie bags as an

incentive for kids to do work well, looking for a pep rally prior to the SOLs to get them excited

- **-Kelly Brown** shared that she has seen from experience that incentivizing the children and getting them pepped up is effective.
- -Need some supplies; glue sticks in particular. **Sheri Quinones** discussed checking the supply in **Mr. Jones**' office and then possibly the PTO could supplement additional supplies needed.
- -3rd grade said there was not a large participation in the CCCH, wondered if there could be something done for Valentine's Day
- -Non-committal about Kids Out Loud; kids did not love it, thought it was "cute"
- -Want to hear back soon about goodie bags incentive
- -Trish Pabis says that PTO can put together
- **-Trish Pabis** proposes that the PTO put together the goodie bags on behalf of the 3rd grade. **Sarah Muminovic** motions for approval. **Danielle Englund** seconds. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.
